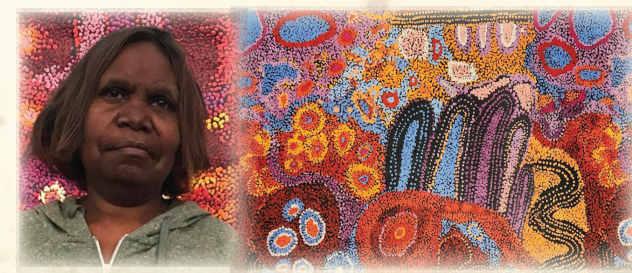

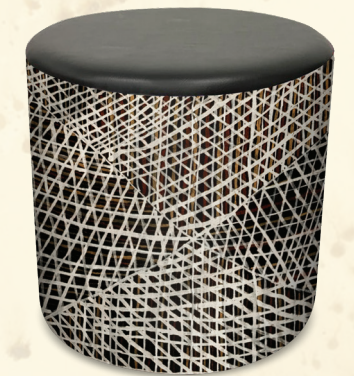

'Pupuni Jilamara'
During a ceremony on the Tiwi Islands a series of yoi (dances) are performed; some are totemic, and some show a narrative of newly composed songs. Participants in these ceremonies are painted with turtiyanginari (the different natural ochre colours), transforming the dancers and, in some cases, provide protection against mapurtiti (spirits.) These significant artistic designs collectively are called Jilamara.

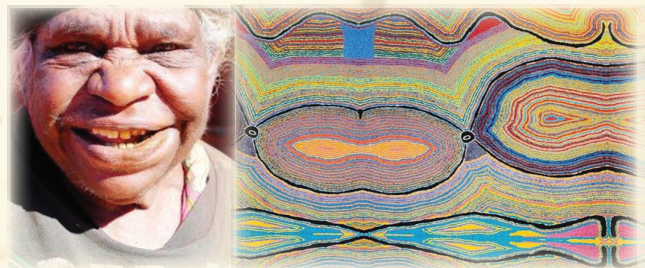

'Wakirlpirri Jukurrpa (Dogwood Tree Dreaming)'
Wakirlpirri is a very useful tree that grows on the sides of creek beds and near mulga trees. The seeds of this tree can be eaten raw or cooked on the fire. A deliciously sweet drink called "yinjirpi" is made from the seeds when they have been dried. The wood can be used to make weapons such as Karli (boomerangs) and dancing boards for ceremonies.
